 power and authority therein as myself might
 or would have

With power also and attorney or attorneys under
 him for that purpose to make and substitute
 and to do all lawful acts for effecting the
 Premises here by ratifying and confirming all
 that my said attorney or his substitute or
 substitutes shall do therein by virtue hereof
 in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand
 and seal the third day of November in the year
 of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and
 Twenty one sealed and delivered in the presence
 of Edward Gibbs Be it known that on the
 third day of November one thousand eight hundred
 and twenty one and in the forty sixth year
 of the independence of the united States of
 America before George W. Eggleston Esq
 Justice of the Supreme in and for the said
 State and notary public by letters patent
 under the seal of the state duly commissioned
 and sworn came Richard W. Otis above
 named and acknowledged the foregoing
 Power of attorney to be his act and deed
 in testimony whereof I have here unto set
 my hand and affixed my seal of office at
 Charleston in the State of South Carolina
 the day and year last mentioned
