E. 27 to a sower wood on the Northen with the various meanders of the said creek to the beginning including seventy four acres together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appertinances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining do have and to hold all and singular the premises here mentioned unto the said Lewis Sudduth his heirs and assigns forever unto the said Lewis Sudduth his heirs and assigns against my self and my heirs every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Except William Brown Spring in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 31 day of Janur. 1821 Sealed
