Know all men by these presents that I Benjamin West of Grunville District & State aforesaid have for an in consideration of the sum of six hundred Dollars, to me in hand paid, by James Harper of Charleston S. Carolina have bargained, granted sold & released, and by these presents do grant, bargain sell, release confirm & convey, unto James Harper, his heirs or assigns a certain plantation or tract of Land, lying and being in the State and District aforesaid on the waters of South Tyger River, containing two hundred acres, more or less. Beginning on a Spanish Oak, a conditional corner, thence South 50. w. to a stake thence N. 35 W. 4. 6. 4 to a white oak, thence S. 57 W. 18. 50 to a white oak, thence N. to a conditional red oak, W. on a conditional line to a Spanish Oak standing in a small Branch, thence S. down the meanders of said branch, to James Adams, heirs Land thence N. on said Adams Land to a conditional Black Oak corner, between said Harper & Lemuel Loftis, on the north side of Wild Cat Creek thence E. on a conditional line to said Creek thence down the meanders of said Creek, to the mouth of a small branch on the S. side of said Creek, thence up the meanders of said branch to a conditional white Oak corner between said Harper and Lemuel Loftis, thence on a conditional line to the beginning Spanish oak corner the same being part of Four Tracts of Land, Together with all and singular the rights members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises here mentioned
