of in, and to the same; To Have and To Hold the said piece
parcel and tract of Land, with its appurtenances, unto the said
Hudson Berry, his heirs and assigns forever, as fully and abso-
lutely as the said A. W. Crowder might, could, or ought to gr-
ant, bargain, and sell the same, by virtue of the Statute afo-
resaid and the said writ of fieri facias or otherwise I do with-
out whose of, &c. the said A. W. Crowder, have hereunto set my
hand and seal the Eleventh day of January in the year of our
lord one thousand eight hundred twenty three sealed signed
