I know all men by these presents that I George Danteky of the district and state aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and sixty three dollars & twenty cents to me in hand paid by George Seaborne of the district and state above mentioned have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant Bargain sell and release unto the said George Seaborne all that plantation or tract of land lying in the district aforesaid on a small branch of the Golden Grove brook being part of a tract of land now owned by me beginning on a red oak on Seaborn's land thence running N. 45° W. 13 chains and fifty links to a White oak thence S. 45° E. 46 chains to a Stake thence N. 11 East 15 chains to a Stake on Cannon and Seaborn's land thence to the beginning containing fifty four acres more or less together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said George Seaborne his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said George Seaborne his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and assigns or against every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof signed sealed and delivered in presence of James J. Bothwell this 14<sup>th</sup> day of February one thousand eight hundred and twenty two
