 of October in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and  
 Twenty four and in the forty eight of American independence  
 of the united States signed sealed and Delivered in the presence  
 of us John Jones, Thomas Howard & Abner Jones  
 State of South Carolina } Personally appeared before me  
 Greenville County } one of the Justices of the peace for  
 said District John Jones and being duly sworn as the law direct  
 to and saith on said oath that he was present and did see  
 Abner Jones sign and deliver the within deed of conveyance  
 to Richard Jones for the use and purpose therein mentioned  
 and that him self and Thomas Howard signed their names  
 as witness to the same sworn to and subscribed their names  
 as witness this 11<sup>th</sup> day of October 1824

 ries, viz Beginning at John Youngs old beginning corner  
 on the Buncomb Road, beginning at John Youngs old be-  
 ginning corner on the Buncombe Road, & running along the  
 said road (the said Road being the western line from the  
 said corner N. 70. W. 40. Chains to a stake on the same Road  
 Thence N. 20. E. 50 chains to a stake, thence S. 70. E. 40 chains,  
 To a stake, thence to the beginning corner as above said having  
 on the East Mrs Catharine Hawkins land on the north Mrs Sus-  
 annah Winans land, and on the South lander, belonging to Capt  
 John McLanahan & the Estate of Washington Earle,
