Know all men by these presents that I John Moore of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of fifty dollar paid in hand by George Long of the district and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said George Long a tract of land lying and being situate in the district and State aforesaid on a small branch waters of Ruddy River it being part of a tract of land belonging to Jas. Seaborn Deceased and sold at his sale Beginning on the west side of the Long branch on a sawerwood thence South 70. to the west to a pine Stake on George Longs line thence South on said Longs line to a Spanish Oak on Longs line thence on said Longs line to a Spanish Oak corner on James basses line thence South East on sd Coxes line to a pine thence North to the beginning corner containing thirty acres be the same more or less. Together with all and singular the right manors hereditaments and appertinances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said George Long and I do hereby bind myself my heirs and Executors and assigns to warrant and ever defend the above described land unto the said George Long his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8 day of February 1819 signed and delivered before us
