that I Polkton Carlton of the District & State aforesd in
consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars, to me in
hand paid by John H. Carlton, of the District and State aforesd
do have granted Bargained & released & by these presents do
grant bargain sell & release unto the D^r John H. Carlton,
two hundred acres, of land more or less lying in Grunville District
on the ready Fork being part of a tract of land granted to Jasper
Hudson, & signed by Governor Moultrie, and part of a tract of
land granted to Thomas Brasher, and signed by Governor
