 cluding two hundred acres of land more or less, Together
 with all & singular the rights, members, hereditaments & appur-
 tenances, the said premises belonging to or in any wise Incid-
 ent or appertaining to have & to hold all & singular the
 premises before mentioned unto the said John M. Curton his heirs
 and assigns forever & I do here by bind myself my heirs, Exec-
 utors, administrators to warrant & forever defend all and sin-
 gular the said two hundred acres of land more or less with
 the premises unto the said John M. Curton his heirs & assigns,
 against myself my heirs & assigns & all & Every other person
 or persons what soever, claiming the same or any part there-
 of In witness whereof I do here unto set my hand & seal this
