South Carolina Greenville District Be it known to  
all men that I John H. Harrison of Greenville district  
in South Carolina for the love affection & paternal  
regard which I entertain for my beloved daughter  
Clarissa Thompson, as well as for the sum of five  
Dollars paid by Samuel Thompson of said state  
and district and various other considerations, me  
there unto moving do by these presents convey along  
& release grant & confirm unto the said Samuel  
=Thompson & Clarissa his wife all that tract or  
parcel of land in said district on Reedy River,  
whereon the said Thompson lately lived & now in  
his actual possession, containing four hundred &  
ten acres, be the same more or less, bounded by a line  
from the Red Oak corner on the old Road at a place  
called the Sandy Hollow, thence S. 61. W. to G. N. L.  
Winnas, line thence S. 24. W. to said Winnas, white  
oak corner which is down thence to a Gum cor-  
ner on the bank of the River at the foot of the  
Bridge the old Bridge is meant thence down  
the River, to the mouth of the creek called the  
Flat Rock Branch thence up the said Creek on  
Stokes' line to a Hickory on the old Road called  
Killets Road thence up the said Road with its  
meanders to the beginning which tract of Land  
I do warrant & forever defend to them the said  
Samuel & Clarissa, their heirs or assigns forever,  
against all manner of claims, of whatsover  
kind & by whomsoever set, In witness whereunto  
I set my hand and affix my seal this 27<sup>th</sup> March  
1824 in presence of  
Moses Cook, Harriet Harrison, John H. Harrison (Seal)
