The State of South Carolina This Indenture made the thirteenth day of February 1826 In the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and twenty six between William H. Salmon of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid of the one part and James Pickett of the same place of the other part Witnesseth that the said William H. stands justly indebted to the said James Pickett in the full and just sum of Ten thousand and four hundred Dollars Good and lawful Money of the said State by bond of equal date here with Interest thereon from this date and to be paid as follows the interest on the principal is to be paid annually first and one tenth of the principal and the first payment becomes due on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February 1827 and on that day in each and every year afterwards until the whole principal and interest be paid a payment is to be made, Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said William H. for and in consideration of the said debt and interest thereon payable as aforesaid to the said James, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said James his heirs Executors, administrators and assigns according to the true intent and meaning of the bond aforesaid and also in consideration of the sum of One hundred dollars to the said William H. by him the said James in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold aliened released conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do Grant bargain sell alien release convey and confirm unto the said James Pickett his heirs and assigns forever all and singular the following Tract of land lying and being In the District of Greenville aforesaid on the north East side of the North fork of Saluda being the same tract that was conveyed to the said William H. by George Salmon by deed dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of May 1825 beginning on a sycamore on the bank of said River, at the mouth of an old ditch running thence N. 56. E. 29 chains to a poplar at the mouth of a ditch cut by Barton thence N. 21. E. 18 chains to a chestnut on a branch up the straight fork thereof to the first fork below a school house thence up the left fork of said Branch to a marked white oak and stake across the road thence N. 33. W. 20 chains to Roddins Red Oak corner, thence the same course 33 chains to Roddins Spanish Oak corner thence N. 75. W. 16 chains to a maple on a Branch thence down said branch to a mountain oak thence S 31. E. 21 chains mountain
