99 I all of South Carolina Greenville District know all men by these presents, that John Thaxton for an amount of the sum of seventy three Dollars to me in hand paid by Eli Baldwin have bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and confirm unto the said Eli Baldwin his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns all that plantation or tract of land whereon the said Thaxton now lives situated lying and being in the District and State aforesaid and on the horse pond creek Waters of Gilders Creek containing by Estimation one hundred acres all the the same more or less it being part of a tract of Land granted to James Barton bearing date the 1st Day of September 1792. Beginning at a pine corner running N. 65. W. 25 chains to a Stake corner thence S. 25 W. 40 chains to a Post oak corner thence S. 65 E. 25 Chains to a pine corner thence N. 25 E. 40 chains to the beginning corner to the adjacent lands the said tract belongs to Henry Stokes and John Cely together with
