 paid and delivered by James Dickerson of State and District aforesaid
 sold Confirmed and released and by these presents and by these presents doth
 grant bargain and sell unto the said James Dickerson all that plantation
 or tract of land whereon I now live situate lying and being in the dis-
 trict aforesaid and one of the branches of the Rudy fork waters of
 Rudy River containing two hundred and fifty acres be the same more
 or less bounding as followeth on the north E. by land of Benjamin
 Pollard Esqr. So by land of James Seaborn north by land we do not
 know the owner of E. by land of Edmand Lanam having such four
 marks and shapes as is fairly laid down in plat annexed to the orig-
 inal grant together with all and singular the rights hereditaments
 to a bene devised premises belonging or in any wise appertaining
 to have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the
 the said James Dickerson and lawful representatives hee will war-
 rant and for ever defend the tittle to be good and do bind our-
 selves to defend the same from our heirs and every other person
 lawfully claiming the same or any part or parcel thereof Given
 under our hands and seals this ninth of December Eighteen hundred
 and two and in the 21 of American independence Signed sealed
 and delivered In the presence of - } Abner ^{his} Bishop Esq

 aforesaid that is to say containing one hundred and eighty one acres more
 or less being part of two tracts of land originally granted to Thomas Serke, the
 other part conveyed to trustees for the use of John McClanahan by Solomon
 Langston on the second day of November 1819 and therein particularly described
 as a reference to the several deeds of conveyance recorded in the Clerk's office
 will more fully appear the whole containing by Estimation one hundred
 and eighty one acres more or less a reference being had to the deed hitherto
 fore recorded and the original grants of the State aforesaid and by
 a survey made by John Young Esqr. a plat hereunto annexed
