ber in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty
Six and made payable for the sum of one hundred and eighty four dol-
lars and also to collect sue for and receive the Interest that may be due
and coming due due on the said Note and also to collect sue for and recover
the sum of three hundred and twenty three dollars twenty cents more due
and owing to me by the Estate of the said J. P. LaBruce, deceased and to collect
sue for recover and receive the whole of the aforesaid sums of money
so due as aforesaid or either of the said amounts or any part of either
or the whole, and for the same when received due discharge,
and full and sufficient acquittances, receipt, and satisfactions
to make, give and do. And I do hereby give unto my said attorney full
power and authority to apply and pay over the aforesaid amounts when
received or any part of the same towards the payment and discharge of a
certain note of hand, bearing date the third day of January in the year of
our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty six signed by me
