 corner thence south wardly on said Roberts line to a post oak c.  
 thence eastwardly to the beginning the said land being a part of and the  
 the east end of a survey laid out to said Springfield being one hundred  
 and ten acres more or less with all and singular the rights hereditaments  
 & appurtenances thereto to have and to hold all & singular the premises before
