in consideration of the sum of twenty pounds to me in hand paid by  
Willis Butter of Laurens County & State aforesaid I the said Reuben  
Copelin have Granted Bargained Sold & Released & by these presents  
do grant Bargain sell & Release unto the said Willis Butter all that  
Tract or parcel of Land containing ninety seven acres. it being a  
part of a tract of 500. acres of land Granted to Isaac Perkins the  
the 4 day of April 1796. & Recorded in Grant Book O. No 59 page  
396 & part said tract Conveyed to said Copelin. the land to be  
conveyed begins on a pine 3x am for said Tract & runs South 14° over  
a branch to a black o. m in all 44 chains to a stake 3x on the  
original line thence an said line due East 22 chains to a red oak bus  
2' 3" m on the old boundary line thence N. or N. 44.00 to a post 0 3x  
on the line Road thence due West 22.00 to the Beginning Pine corner the lan-  
d situate in the County of Grenville & State aforesaid on both sides  
of Grays branch waters of Gilders Creek. Together with all & singular  
or the Rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Pre-  
mises belonging or in any wise appertaining or incident to have & to  
hold all the said premises before mentioned unto the said Willis  
Butter his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby Bind myself  
my heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant & for ever defend all & singular  
or the said premises unto the said Willis Butter his heirs & assigns against myself  
& my heirs & against every Person whosoever lawfully claiming or to claim  
the same or any part thereof Witness my hand & seal this ... day of ... in  
the year of our Lord 1797 and in the 22<sup>nd</sup> year of the Independence of the
