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State of South Carolina Whereas Langdon Chevis and James Mc Dowell, Executors of Alexander McDowell did by their petition to the Honorable Court of Equity at the session therop held for Newberry District in June Term 1826 set forth that William Dunlap who acted as attorney for Alexander McDowell in his life time for the sale of his lands in the Back Country of this State did in his capacity of attorney aforesaid sell Bargain and Contract with James Kilgore a tract of said McDowell's land containing five hundred acres, an acreys back in Spartanburgh District at fifty cents per acre to be paid in three installments viz the first on the 1st March 1807 and the other two on the 1st October in each year after and whereas the said James Kilgore did pay to the said Mr. Dunlap on the 14 April 1807 the sum of fourtynine dollars thirty three cents in part payment.
