LaBruce in his life time, leading from the Village of Granville across Rudy River to the Augusta Road and more generally known and distinguished as the Road to LaBruce Mill. To Have and to Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned which are hereby conveyed, together with the joint-right of way as aforesaid, unto the said John Bradley his heirs and assigns forever. And we the said Catharine LaBruce Executrix, and the said LeGrand G. Walker Executor as aforesaid do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs Executors, and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said John Bradley his heirs and assigns, against ourselves and our heirs, and against every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same of any part thereof. Witness our hands and seals this Eleventh day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty eight, and in the fifty third year of the Independence of the United States of America
