




 an in consideration of the sum sixty four dollars and fifty cents to me in hand paid by Thomas Taylor of the district aforesaid have granted sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Thomas Taylor all that tract or parcel of land supposed to be sixty four acres and a half more or less lying and being on Enoree River beginning on a black oak on Thomas Taylor's line from thence with said line to a post oak thence S. 41. E. 15. to a poplar thence E. 9 to a red oak thence N. 7 to a chestnut corner thence down the south side of Mountain Creek to a black gum corner on the bank of the River thence up the river to red oak corner from thence a conditional line to the beginning corner Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Thomas Taylor his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Thomas Taylor his heirs and assigns for ever against myself my heirs and against every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof witnesses my hand and seal this the thirteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred twenty nine fifty fourth year of American Independence and in the presence of John <sup>his</sup> Brown, Jacob Bridwell } Gipson Southern
