

Waters of Rudy River and by estimation containing thirteen acres it being part of a tract of land originally granted to James A. Pollard and signed by his Excellency Joseph Alston on the 17 of Nov 1814 laid out as follows begining on a red oak on William Cottons line from thence along sd. Cottons line running N. 30. W. 16 to a hickory 3x. thence down the branch running with Mr. Lee's line to a conditional corner on sd. branch thence to the begining including thirteen acres of land Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the sd. Moses Cockrell his heirs & assigns for ever & I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors to warrant & forever defend the same unto the said Moses Cockrell his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs and every other person or persons lawfully claiming. Same or any part thereof in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this the 4th of April 1826, signed sealed and delivered in presence of Geo. Seaborn, J.W. Croft Ichie Deen Seal

Blasingame Greenville Dist. of the State and district above written for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen dollars to me paid by Mary Seaborn of the State and district aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have bargained sold and released and by these presents do bargain sell and release unto the said Mary Seaborn her heirs and assigns for ever all that tract or parcel of land lying in the State aforesaid & dist. of Greenville On the Golden Grove Creek of Saluda River and containing three acres which sd. tract is laid out to the said Mary Seaborn as follows Begining on a black Oak the original corner and running S 49. W. 7. 14 chains to a stone fence N. 2. W. 10. 38. chains to a red Oak & thence E 817. chains to the begining it being part of a tract originally granted to Henry Pendleton. Together with all and singular the rights &c thenceunto belonging or in any wise incident to have had to hold all and singular the premises unto the sd. Mary Seaborn her heirs &c and I the said William E. Blasingame do for myself my heirs and assigns warrant and forever defend the sd. bargained premises unto the sd. Mary Seaborn her heirs &c against myself my heirs &c and against any and every other person claiming the same or any part thereof In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the fifth day of July in the year of our Lord an thousand eight hundred and thirty and in the fifty fourth year of the American Independence. signed sealed and delivered in the presence of William Pickens, Geo.
