

Ninth day of December in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight
hundred and thirty between John Brittenden of the one part and
William Joney of the other part, witnesses whereas, the said John
Brittenden stands indebted to the said William Joney in the sum of
Ten Thousand dollars by five separate promissory notes under seal of
Two Thousand dollars each, the first due and payable 1st day of Octr 1831
and one falls due on that day in each succeeding year till all are
due, and all draw interest from the said first day of October eighteen
hundred and thirty one until paid. Now this Indenture witnesses that
the said John Brittenden for and in consideration of the said
debt or sum payable as aforesaid, to the said William Joney, and
for the better securing the payment thereof to the said William Joney ac-
cording to the intent and meaning of the said five notes aforesaid, and also
in consideration of the sum of Five dollars by him the said William
Joney in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these
presents do grant, bargain sell, release, convey and confirm unto
the said William Joney and to his heirs and assigns forever all those
six pieces or lots of Land situated in the Village of Greenville in the
State aforesaid the first is that on which the said William Joney's Store and
Billard House stand being the north end of Lots No. 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, the other five
lots are numbered in the plan of the said Village seven, eight, nine,
ten and thirteen, No. 7, 8, 9, 10, and 13, and is the very same conveyed by
the said William Joney to the said John Brittenden by deed bearing
Equal date herewith, and is hereby mortgaged to secure the
purchase money of said lots and for a more particular
