

The State of South Carolina } This Indenture made and entered into
 Greenville District } between Samuel Turner and Elizabeth
 Turner of the first part and James Gidley of the other part all of the
 District first above written. Witnesseth that the said Samuel Turner &
 Elizabeth Turner his wife a gave on their part to pett and hire to the
 said James Gidley a certain free white Boy named William Stubbs aged Ten
 years for the Term of six years and six months for which term of service
 the said William Stubbs is to be under the care, management, and control of the
 said James Gidley and him to obey and serve in common dayly labour which
 is common or necessary as a hireling for which the said James Gidley a gives
 on his part to furnish meat Lodging & Clothing good and halsom diet such
 as is or would be necessary for a person to work on and to treat the said Willi-
 am Stubbs as one of the members of his family in a humane manner and
 for the said Boys services as aforesaid the said James Gidley a gives on
 his part to pay off a certain Judgment or the balance thereof
 which is Twenty nine dollars and one cent. Now in the Shuff's office
 against the said Samuel Turner in favour of John S. Edwards a
 reference thereto will more fully shew and it is Expressly understood
 that the said William is to stay and abide with the said James Gidley
 the said six years & six months and not to leave the premises of the said
 James at no time without his permission to do so. and the said James is
 to Exercise any legal & proper means to compel him the said William
 to stay and perform his duty in every respect necessary to be done in such
 case made and provided. and it is further agreed that the said
 James Gidley is to pay the further sum of Twelve dollars to the
 said Samuel Turner for the services of the said boy. In witness
 whereof we have interchangeably set our hands and seals
 this thienteenth day day of November A.D 1830.
