 & in consideration of the sum of thirteen hundred & thirty dollars to me
 in hand paid by Burrill Chiche of said State & District have granted, bar-
 gained, sold, and released & by these presents do grant, bargain, sell & release
 unto the said Burrill Chiche a certain tract or parcel of land, situate
 lying in the said State & District on the waters of Rich Land Creek, whereon
 J. David Goodlett recently lived containing one hundred and eighty acres
 or the same more or less having courses & distances as follows beginning on
 a white oak corner, on the N. East side of the lister Creek running thence
 South thirty East twelve chain fifty links to a red oak, thence S. forty five
 west thirty nine chain to red oak, thence S. fifteen W. twenty seven chain
 to a stone, thence North sixty nine west twenty five chain 89 links
 to a stake, thence North forty seven chain 90 links to a live holly or pop-
 lar thence North twenty four East one chain 90 links to red oak
 thence South eighty one east two chain 65 links to chestnut thence
 North eighty six East four chain 62 links to chestnut, thence East
 three chains to poplar, thence North eighty two East three ¹/₂ in
 50 links to chestnut, thence South Eighty two East two chains 40
 links to red oak, thence South forty nine East seven chain
