

307. The State of South Carolina

To all to whom these Presents shall come... Knowing full well that in
pursuance of an Act of the Legislature entitled "An Act for establishing the
mode of granting the Land now vacant in this State and for allowing a com-
mission to be received for some Lands that have been granted passed the 19th
day of February 1771 We have granted and by these presents do Grant unto James
Benney his heirs and Assigns a Plantation or Tract of Land containing
One thousand nine hundred and thirty three acres surveyed for him the
5 March 1836 situate in Greenville District in the waters of Mountain Creek and
Crawblanc Creek of Eno River and waters of Ruddy River including the
Bald Rock and nearly the whole of the N.W. end of new Beulowson or Paris
Mountain having such things and marks as are represented by a Plat hereunto
annexed together with all woods trees waters water courses Profits Commodities
Appurtenances and Hereditaments whatsoever thereto belonging To Have
and To Hold the said Tract of One thousand nine hundred and thirty three
Acres of Land and all and singular, other the Premises hereby granted unto
the said James Benney his heirs and Assigns forever in full and complete sover-
eignty under the State of the State.
