



Hodges for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by John Hodges of the District and State aforesaid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have bargained sold and released and by these presents do bargain, sell and release & convey to the said John Hodges all my right title interest and estate in and to the tract of Land specified in the foregoing Deed of eleven hundred and eighty six acres situate in the North fork of Saluda River in said District, which was conveyed by G. F. Towne Commissioner in Equity to John Hodges and John W. Hodges. And hereby warrant and defend the same to the said John Hodges and his heirs and assigns forever, against me and my heirs and against all persons claiming by or through me.
