 below the mouth of a branch thence running nearly ^{parallel} with the branch N
 65 E. 35.25 to a Hickory 3^x (or stake) bounded by Coles land thence N 37 W. 69
 .50 to a Stake bounded by land that Joseph McCullough bought from Mason
 Davis thence about S. 83. W. 5^y or a straight line from the last mentioned corner
 to a Stake corner on the Bank of the said River being a corner of the land
 formerly belonging to the estate of John Alexander but now Tally Boling's
 land and bounded the whole length of the line by the said Tally Boling's
 land thence down the wanders of said River to the beginning. Together with
 all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to
 the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. To
 have and to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned
 unto the said Robert Davenport his heirs and assigns forever and I
 do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant
 and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Robert
 Davenport his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs and further
 if any of the said land should be held by an older title then I am to pay
 back to the said Robert Davenport or his assigns at the rates of three dollars
 per Acre for what is lost without interest. Witness my hand and seal
