The tract of land whereon I now live in the waters of Little Mountain
Creek waters of Inoore River. Containing about One hundred acres
bounded by lands of W. E. Wickliffe Daniel Pike & James Hooker with
the present crop thereon. One cow and calf six head of hogs all the
plantation tools household and kitchen furniture and every other
article appertaining to the said lands houses trees tools Crockery potter
provisions Bedding Chairs tables &c to be theirs forever from me and
my heirs and from every other person whatever in any wise claiming
or to claim the same or any part thereof
