 I, William M. Goodlett Sheriff of Greenville District, and State aforesaid, send
 greeting: Whereas, by virtue of sundry Writs of Fieri Facias, issued out of the
 Court of Common Pleas, held for the district of Greenville one tested the tenth
 day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty
 at the suit of William Neaves (et al.) to me directed, commanding me, that
 of the goods and chattels, lands and tenements, of Abner H. Moon to levy the
 sum of Fifty three dollars damages and costs. I have seized and taken of the
 lands and tenements of the said Abner H. Moon all that certain piece, parcel
 and tract of land, containing Two Hundred & five (more or less) acres, situate
 and being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on the waters of Cross
 River adjoining lands of Samuel Gibson, Samuel Styles & others. Also one
 other tract adjoining the above tract, and known as the Taylor tract, cont-
 aining One hundred and sixty Two Acres, more or less
 And Whereas, the said premises, with their appurtenances since the seizure
 by me made, by virtue of the said Writs of Fieri facias before mentioned have been
 exposed to sale at public vendue and purchased by Chaney Stroud of the
 district and State aforesaid for the sum of Four hundred & nineteen dollars
 being the highest sum that was bidden therefor. Now Know Ye, That
 I, William M. Goodlett Sheriff aforesaid, by virtue of the said Writs of fieri
 facias aforesaid, to me directed and delivered as aforesaid, and by virtue
 of the Statute in such case made & provided, and for and in consideration
 of the said sum of Four hundred & nineteen dollars to me in hand paid
 or secured, to be paid by the said Chaney Stroud the receipt & payment
 whereof I do hereby acknowledge, have granted bargained and sold
 and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the said Chaney
 Stroud his heirs and assigns forever the tracts pieces and parcels of land with
 their appurtenances and all the estate right title and interest which the said
 Abner H. Moon of right had of in & to the same
