And, I do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors and administrators to warrant & defend all and singular the said premises (except as above excepted) unto the said James Pickett his heirs & assigns, against myself & my heirs, and against every person whomsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, except that part above herein excepted.
