

Robert A. Maxwell Esq. State of South Carolina, Person attesting by these presents,
 Greenville District, That I Robert A. Maxwell of the
 District of Anderson State aforesaid, for & in consideration
 of the sum of five hundred dollars to me paid by Bro Richardson,
 have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain
 and sell unto the said John Richardson, the two parcels of land below described, to
 wit, first a tract of thirty two and a half acres more or less as represented by a plat
 thereof, described by George Seaton D.S. 14th Decr 1833, lying on the eastern side of
 Golden Grove Creek which separates it from the second parcel below described, S.E.
 by lands once Pantersley now Chapman's S.E. by lands of Robert A. Maxwell now John
 Richardson's, Second a tract of about twelve acres and a half on the western side
 of Golden Grove Creek aforesaid bounded east by said creek separating it from
 the first parcel above described et. By S. Janants Land M.R. by lands which I sold
 to John Richardson including the mouth of pearl bed branch and contained within
 lines beginning on the eastern Bank of Golden Grove Creek in a Black Gum 3x0
 thence across said creek N. 80° 45' W. 150 to a Rock 3x0 in field, thence S. 57° W.
 22.34 to a Stake in Yungmire, thence S. 46° E. 19.30 to a dogwood 3x0. on the
 Eastern bank of said creek, thence all the meander of said creek to the Black
 Gum 3x0. to beginning together with all and singular the rights members, heri-
 taments & appurtenances, to the said land as above described belonging or in any
 wise incident or appertaining to, To Ware and To Hold all and singular the premises
 above described to the said John Richardson his heirs and assigns forever, And I
 do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and
 forever defend all and singular the premises aforesaid to the said John Richardson
 his heirs and assigns forever, and against all persons lawfully claiming or to claim
 the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand Seal this 22nd of June in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty two.
