 To Greenville District, present by then
 Samuel Williams, presents that I, John Townsend of Greenville
 District and State aforesaid, in consideration
 of the sum of one thousand dollars to me paid by Samuel Williams
 of Greenville District and State aforesaid, have granted, bargained,
 sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell,
 and release unto the said Samuel Williams, all that tract of
 Land whereon I now live, situate lying and being in Greenville
 District on the branches of the Golden Grove, and Pury fork, con-
 taining five hundred and sixty six acres more or less, granted to John
 Pickens on the 7th day of Decr 1818. Beginning in the North east
 of the Augusta Road on a Post Oak thence South 49° W. 48. to post
 Oak 112 x thence North 41° W. 24. to Post Oak 112 x thence S. 49° W. 22 to
 Post Oak 112 x thence S. 11° W. 32 to a Stake 112 x thence S. 48° E. 68 to poplar
 112 x down, thence N. 43° E. 9. 87. to a post Oak 112 x thence N. 24° W. 22 to
 a Black 112 x, thence N. 74° E. 47 to Spanish Oak 112 x thence N. E. 15°-33 to
 a Stake 112 x thence N. 41° W. 42 to the beginning corner, Together, with
 all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to
 the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining,
 To have and to hold, all and singular the premises before mentioned,
 unto the said Samuel Williams his heirs and assigns forever. And I do
 hereby bind myself my heirs executors, and administrators to warrant
 and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said,
 Samuel Williams his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs
 and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to
 claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and Seal
 this 28th day of December 1842 and in the 67th year of the independence
