 Robinson, seven negroes, to wit, Charity, about thirty
 years of age, Adeline, about eleven years of age,
Sauve, about nine years of age, Adam, about
 six years of age, Henry, about four years of age,
Lane, about two years of age, and Louisa, an infant
 the last six being the children of Charity. To have
 & to hold, the said negroes, in trust for the use,
 and benefit of Maria Ann Robinson the wife of
 the aforesaid William Robinson, during her natural
 life, and at her death, in trust to and for the
 use and benefit of the children of the said Maria
 A. Robinson living at the time of her death, and
 I do hereby bind myself to warrant & forever
 defend the title to the said negroes, to the said
 Wm Robinson in trust for the uses above mentioned
 as well as that they are slaves for life, against
 me and my heirs and also against every person
 claiming or to claim the same - Witness my
 hand and seal this 24th December 1842
