

Original Deed delivered to
Greenville County Sheriff 1843.

...ents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said James McCullough two plantations or tracts of land containing two hundred and ten acres more or less situate in the District aforesaid the larger tract lying on a branch of Pine Creek waters of Saluda River, beginning on a stone 3x on the river and running thence N 69° E 54° 00' to a stake 3x bounded by George Gambrell thence S 47° E 11° 75' to a stone corner bounded by the said George Gambrell thence N 52° E 32° 00' to a dogwood 3x bounded by Mr Nabors thence N 42° W 24° 10' to a stake 3x thence S 48° W 34° 00' to a stake 3x thence N 0 47° W 29° 00' to a hickory 3x thence S 31° W 41° 50' to a Chinquapin 3x on the river thence down the meanders of the same to the beginning. The smaller tract situate and lying on the waters of Mountain Creek beginning on a hickory 3x and running thence S 13° W 38° 25' to a stone 3x bounded by John McCullough's land. Thence N 47° W 9° 80' to a hickory 3x bounded by Nathaniel Barnes thence N 13° E 33° 50' to a red oak 3x bounded by John McClock, thence S 75° E 8° 10' to the beginning bounded by the said Joseph McCullough's land. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the same belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James McCullough his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said James McCullough his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this the first day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty three and in the sixty eighth year of the Independence of the United States of America
