I, Maria P. Garrison, of the State and
 District aforesaid, acknowledge myself justly indebted to Vandy McBar of the
 same place, the full and just sum of two hundred and one dollars and 43 cents,
 and for which sum I have this day executed my Note of Hand to him, as will
 appear by reference therof, and for the better securing the payment thereof,
 to the said Vandy or his assigns, I have this day and by these presents do
 bargain, sell and deliver unto the said Vandy, a certain Negro boy named Allen,
 about ten or twelve years of age, to have and to hold the said Negro boy Allen
 unto the said Vandy his heirs and assigns forever. Provided nevertheless, that
 if the said Mr. P. Garrison should pay or cause to be paid to the said Van-
 dy or assigns, the aforesaid sum of two hundred and one dollars and forty-
 three cents, with lawful interest thereon, on or before the 25th day of December
 next, then and in that case this Deed of bargain and sale shall be void and
 of none effect. But it is further agreed, and it is the perfect understanding
 of the parties, that if the said sum of \$201.43 cents according to the obligation,
 with interest should not be paid on or before the 25th day of December next, that
 then and in that case the said Vandy is hereby fully authorized after ten days
 public notice to sell or cause the said Negro boy Allen to be exposed to pub-
 lic sale, at the Court House in Greenville, and after satisfying the amount
 he is obligated for according to the obligation, and costs and expenses
 over may be remaining, he is to pay over to the said Maria P. Garrison
 her heirs or assigns, within five days after paid sale, and as the said boy Al-
 len is now walking with Dyer & Company, Tailors in this place. It is the bar-
 gain and understanding that the said Vandy may and is to have the control
 of the said boy, either to let him continue with the said Tailors for the
 time until the 25th day of December next as aforesaid, or take him into his
 own profession. Witness my hand and seal, this 11th day of January, 1843.
