Gantt, to me, by deed bearing date, the third day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one, being governed by the same miles and bounds, reference being thereunto had, Together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold, all and singular the Premises before mentioned, unto the said John H. Mackley his Heirs and Assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend, all and singular the said Premises, unto the said John H. Mackley his Heirs and Assigns, against me and my Heirs, and against every person whatsoever, lawfully claiming or to claim the same, in any part thereof.
