Deed of 164 Acres.

South Carolina, I know all men by the Greenville District. Presents, That I, Anderson W. Sheppard, of the District of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by William M. Goodlett

of the District and in the State aforesaid, I have granted, bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said William M. Goodlett, All that tract or parcel of Land situate, lying and being in the District and State aforesaid on both sides of a branch, called "Mill branch" the waters of the fall of Saluda River, being the same whereon I now live, and bounded as follows, (viz) beginning at a Poplar corner on a branch, thence running down the various meanderings of said branch 69 chains to an Elm wood 3 x, thence South 14° East, 6 chains 50 links to a Red Oak, 3 x, then North 53° West 21 chains to a stately 3 x, Doct. A. S. Crook's corner, thence along Doct. Crook's line, a South West course to William West's corner, thence North 86° East 14 chains 75 links to a Red Oak 3 x, then North 8 chains to a Red Oak 3 x thence N. 50° E. 20 chains to a Maple 3 x, at a branch, thence N. 74° E. 46 chains to the beginning corner, containing One Hundred and Sixty-four Acres, be the same more or less, together with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining: To have and to hold, all and singular the Premises before mentioned, unto the said William M.
