Kinney a certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the District and State aforesaid on the North side of Muckleguth or found branch of said Creek being a part of land originally granted to Geo Nicol (sen.) by him conveyed to Richard Russell by Russell to Richard Forest by Forest to Henry Prince by Prince to Washington Nicol it being the lower end of the above named tract or survey and bounds by lands of William Southern, Alfred Turner C. Rhodes A. Roberts and Mary Allen supposed to contain One Hundred Acres be the same more or less, Together with all and singular the rights, members, tenements and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Joseph M. Kinney his heirs and assigns forever, I, William Tillery, do send myself, my heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and well defend all & singular the premises above mentioned to the said Joseph M. Kinney his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs Executors & administrators and against all singular the claim of any other person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim any part thereof.
