But if the said Abigail Mariah should die without leaving any living issue then the above described Lands is to revert back to my Estate, and be disposed of as directed in my Will, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Abigail Mariah, and the issue of her body after my Death, the right of the property not to be changed till then from myself and from my heirs and from every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this Tenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-four and in the sixty-eight year of the Independence of the United States of America.
