



Provided, always, and these presents are upon this special trust and confidence, and upon this express condition, that he the said P. F. Young his executors, administrators, and assigns, shall and do permit and suffer me the said Mary Young to keep the said Negro Boy William during my natural life, without paying or yielding any thing for the same, or in respect thereof, and not otherwise; and that from and after my decease, he the said P. F. Young, his executors, administrators, or assigns, shall or lawfully may have, hold, and enjoy the same, forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, to warrant and forever defend the said Negro Boy William unto the said P. F. Young his heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, and against any person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same.

In testimony whereof, I hereunto set my hand and seal, this fourth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty six, and in the seventieth year of American Independence.
