
I know all men by these presents, that I William M. Goodlett of Greenville  
District in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of  
Six Hundred and three dollars to me paid by Reuben J. Smith  
of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained,  
sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell  
and release, unto the said Reuben J. Smith all that tract or par-  
cel of land situate lying and being in the District and State afore-  
said on both sides of a branch called Mill branch the waters of  
the North fork of Saluda River, being the same bought by me from  
A. W. Sheppard and bounded as follows (viz) beginning at a Poplar  
corner on a branch thence running down the various meanderings  
of said branch 69 chains to a grove wood 3x. thence S 14° E. 60 C  
50 Links to a R. C. 3x thence S 53° W. 21 C to a stake 3x Dock  
A. P. Crooks corner, thence along Dr. Crooks line a S. W. Course  
to William Wests stake corner, thence S 86° E. 14 C. 75 L. to a  
R. C. 3x. thence W 8 C. to a R. C. 3x thence N 50° E. 20 C to a maple  
3x at a branch, thence N 74° E. 40 C. to the beginning corner con-  
taining One hundred and sixty four acres more or less.

Together with all and singular the Rights,  
Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises be-  
longing, or in anywise incident or appertaining: To have and  
to hold, all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto  
the said Reuben J. Smith his Heirs and Assigns forever. And  
I do hereby bind myself, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to  
warrant and forever defend, all and singular the said Premises, un-  
to the said Reuben J. Smith his Heirs and Assigns, against me  
and my Heirs, and against every person whatsoever, lawfully claim-  
ing it to claim the same, or any part thereof.
