 Blakely of Greenville District and State  
 aforesaid farmer for an incen consideration of the

sum of One hundred and Twenty five dollars to me in hand paid by Elijah Pike  
 of the District and State aforesaid Have granted, bargained, sold and released  
 and by these presents do Grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Elijah Pike his  
 heirs and assigns all that Tract or parcel of Land containing Six Hundred and forty  
 acres, be the same more or less, Excepting Sixty acres of the same, which I have  
 heretofore set off to Lewis Pike, as may appear by the Deed I made him Subscrib-  
 ing and being in the former district of Mind, Six now Greenville District on  
 the waters of Needy River and Creech said to be bounded at the time of the  
 original survey by vacant land, Originally granted to John Goodwin by  
 him conveyed Martin Herrow Lany the 4th of March 1791. by Lany conveyed to John  
 Goodwin the 1st of August 1795 By Mr Goodwin conveyed to John Lany the 20th  
 day of February 1799 and by said Lany conveyed to the said Blakely the 22nd of  
 November 1800 and hath such shapes form and marks as appears by the plat to  
 the Original Grant annexed Granted the 22nd day of March 1787
