

John Watson	Deed	For the sum of "One all mon by three presents Greenville District) that I John Watson of the District and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of One dollar to me in hand paid by my son William H. Watson have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release a certain small tract or lot of Land containing Seven and one fourth acres more or less Situated in said District on both sides of the Eastern fork of Rich- land Creek of Weedy River adjoining lands of Mrs. Stow, E. Green, Capt. Rev. Mrs. Hunt and Hammond in being part of a tract of land originally granted to Samuel James Alston which grant of Land was conveyed by said Alston to my far the John Watson deceased and I as representative of said deceased and having by gift come into possession and ownership of the above mentioned with other lands

The tract now to be conveyed hath such marks bounds as follow  
Beginning at a Blk Gum 3x on a branch Thence W 65° C. 2.25 ch to a stake  
Stump 3x Thence S 30° E 14.50 chs to a Post Oak Thence S 65° W 3.50 chs to a stake 3x Thence  
W 34° W 18. chs to a Stake 3x Thence N 45° C. 3.60 ch to a Poplar 3x on the aforesaid

and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said  
premises unto the said William H. Watson his heirs and assigns against myself and  
my heirs only lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof
