that I Alexander G Powers of the District aforesaid  
for and in consideration of the sum of Six Hundred

Dollars to me in hand paid by Lewis H. Dickey of the same place have given unto  
me bargained sold and released and conveyed unto the said Lewis H. Dickey his  
heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land situated in said District  
on the said Hole fork of Middle Tyger River Beginning on a White oak  
Tree W 45° E 34.50 to a White oak Tree N 48° 14' W. 10.58 Spanish oak stumps Thence  
N 22° 15' W 20.75 chestnut S 37° 17' W 23.32 Pine Thence S 60° W 15.20 Pinewood  
Thence S 96° 22' E Pine Thence S 36° 9' E 7.87 Spanish oak Thence N 9° E  
5.42 to a White oak Thence S 88° E 36.38 to the Beginning Containing One  
Hundred and Fifty Acres more or less To have and to hold the above described  
premises with all the rights, privileges, immunities, appendages and appurtenances  
belonging or appertaining to the same unto the said Dickey his heirs, administrators  
and assigns. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors, administrators  
and assigns to warrant and defend the above premises against myself my heirs,  
executors, administrators or any other person lawfully claiming the same.
