 To A. B. McGilvray Sen Greenville District } That I Stephen H Wood
 of Pontotoc County in the State of Mississippi
 do hereby in consideration of the sum of One Hundred
 Dollars to me paid by A. B. McGilvray of Greenville District in the State aforesaid have
 granted, bargained, sold, released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and
 release unto the said A. B. McGilvray all my interest or right or title in that planta-
 tion or tract of Land Situated being and lying in Greenville District and State of
 South Carolina on the road leading to Wilson Ferry about seven miles from Greenville
 Court House being the same tract which Stephen H. Hollaway Deceased formerly bore and
 on which he died The said Land was devised in the last will and Testament of the said Stephen
 Hollaway as follows I give and bequeath and devise to my beloved wife Nancy Hollaway
 during the natural life the whole of my Lands and plantation which I may die possessed
 of to be fully possessed by her and at her death the one half of said Lands to go to my
 daughter Mary Manah Hollaway and the other half to be at the disposal of my said wife
 in any manner she may think proper This is my will that should my said daughter
 Mary Manah die leaving no bodily issue the said portion herein given
 to her to go to my surviving children or child or to their any and if there should be no surviving
 child or children the said portion to go to my son Stephen H. Wood of Alabama Whom
 the said daughter Mary Manah Hollaway has died and in consequence of her death I
 the said Stephen H. Wood became entitled to the share of the said Land in compliance with
 the requisitions of said Will

Together with all and singular the Rights, Membrs, Hereditaments
 and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining

To have and to hold all and singular the Premises before mentioned unto
 the said A. B. McGilvray and Nancy McGilvray (late Nancy Hollaway) their Heirs
 and assigns against me and my Heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully
 claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
