of Brunswick State of Virginia by his last Will and Testament dated the 21<sup>st</sup>  
July 1796 did bequeath to Chedance Culy a certain negro woman Lucy with an estate  
in remainder therein to the heirs of Chedance Culy at his death and whereas the said  
Chedance Culy has departed this life and the increase of the said Lucy now consists  
of seven negroes Peling, Lucy, Nestina, Andrew, Mary, Mintha and Sarah's Jasper  
and whereas we Saml Fair (as the assignee of William H. Culy, John W. Culy,  
Henry M. Culy, Ann M. Culy, Moses Pritchett, Solomon Joseph Williams  
J. W. W. W. and Williams McShuffly are the heirs at Law of the said Chedance Culy  
and whereas the heirs at Law all being of full age are desirous of avoiding the expense  
and trouble of an administration upon the estate of said Chedance Culy Do now there-  
fore we do hereby agree and covenant to and with each other to dispose of the seven  
above mentioned slaves in the following manner to wit The woman Mintha being  
a foolish or idiotic cheld, Jasper we consider them taken together to be of little value  
and we do hereby agree to give them gratuitously to Ann M. Culy who has agreed  
to accept them and we do hereby authorize Henry M. Culy to sell the five other negroes
