yer of Tyger River Beginning on a Willow 3<sup>rd</sup> on the Banks of the creek Thence \$32 77 18<sup>th</sup> of  
Nov<sup>th</sup> Thence \$30 40 until it reaches a tree which runs back to the creek in such a chay  
a manner as to equally divide all the land formerly owned by the Ballou's on the South  
side of middle Tyger between the s<sup>r</sup> Reason Ballou & Mary Ballou the lower part being  
conveyed by the Ballou's to me & the upper part to Mary Ballou Thence down the creek  
to the Beginning containing 44<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Acres more or less.

To have and to hold all and singular the above described premises  
& I do hereby bind myself my heirs & assigns to warrant and forever defend the above de-
