Dalg all that Tract Lot or parcel of Land being and lying and situated in said District in the waters of Muck Creek a branch of South Tyger River beginning at a red oak Stake Thence S 11° 42' 23" to Stake Thence S 16° 41' to a Red Oak Stake Thence N 56° 20' 45" to a Stake Thence N 67° 6' 35" to a Red Oak Stake Thence N 30° E 10.50 to Stake Thence N 43° 41' to a Red Oak Stake Thence N 34' West to the beginning containing by estimation One Hundred and Twenty Seven and a half acres being a part of a Tract originally granted to David Morington and from a regular chain of title to William P. Paul and from him to me Philip Dalg and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and Administrators to warrant and favour defende all and singular the said premises unto the said P. Dalg his heirs and assigns forever and against every other person unjustly claiming the same or any part thereof.
