dollars to me paid in hand, have granted, bargained and sold with Hugh Bishop
a certain Tract or parcel of Land, containing one hundred and fifty
acres the same being more or less, lying and being in the District aforesaid, beginning
in a White oak corner near the Deane dam (beetle) from thence down
the line to a Maple corner, thence down the meanders of
Creek to a Stock Gun corner from thence N. 60° W. 50 chains to a Holly corner
thence down said branch N. 60° W. to Maple corner thence S 40° W. to a red oak
corner N. 19° 50' to a red oak on Powell's line thence S 16° 39' to a red oak corner
thence S 53° E to the beginning corner

To have and to hold unto the said Hugh Bishop the above
granted premises his heirs and assigns forever together with all and singular
rights members, tenements and appurtenances thereto belonging or in
anywise incident or appertaining and the said Sam'l C. Clardy have by these my
heirs and assigns forever to warrant and defend the said premises unto the
said Hugh Bishop his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs assigns
and against any and every other person or persons lawfully claiming or
claiming the same or any part thereof
