 date the 12th of April 1814 including the balance of the tract that was not sold
 to E. Pruitt beginning on a Hickory Shrub N 77 E 15 ch to a stake Shrub
 E. 34 ch to a stake Shrub S 54 W 82 ch to a chestnut Shrub to Pruitt line
 and with this line to the original line Shrub with the original line to the
 beginning containing by estimation Twenty Acres More or Less

Together with all and singular the rights members
 and appurtenances thereto belonging I the said Elisha Pruitt do hereby
 myself my heirs Executors Administrators and assigns warrant and guarantee
 defend the above mentioned premises unto the said John Caswell his heirs Ex-
 -ecutors Administrators and assigns against myself my heirs and assigns
 and against every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim
 the same or any part thereof
