Know all men by these Presents that I Sarah E Doyley of the State of

North Carolina and Greenville District for and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars beside my natural love and affection for my son Charles W Doyley to me in Charis paid and before the sealing and delivery of these presents by the said Charles W Doyley my son the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain sell and deliver to the said Charles W Doyley the following negro slaves one boy named David son of Bolinda, and Jane daughter of Bolinda two in number. I do give and do hold to the said Charles W Doyley his Executors Administrators and assigns to him and his only proper use and behoof forever and I the said Sarah E Doyley my Executors and Administrators the said bargained premises unto the said Charles W Doyley his Executors and Administrators and assigns from and against all persons shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Greenville on the ninth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty four and in the 7th year of the Independence of the United States of America
